#### Objective and course content:

The course focuses on the explanation of the institutional architecture of the EU. It provides comprehensive information on all major EU institutions and offers starting points for further research. In its first part, the course focuses on enlargements rounds, methods of treaty revisions and the constitutional development of the European Union in the past decades. In the second and major part, the evolution of the EU institutional architecture is analysed. The course text analyses the institutions from a legal and a living perspective. The last chapter is dedicated to the different scenarios of deepening and widening.
