Objective and course content:

Part 1: Communism to democracy

Main content: European integration and the enlargement process of the EU

Part 2: Is this European integration a model for other regions in the world?

Main content: The question is answered by exploring South-East -Asian experiences of integration, whereby the following fields will be analysed

- * Role of privatisation
- * De-centralization policies
- Regional development policies
- State role and political economy

The starting point for the comparison focuses on the observation that almost all of the states in both regions have disappeared during a long period under various foreign rules what makes the <u>national</u> sovereignty the highest praised value once the states became independent. Within a theoretical framework the question will be discussed "Strong states vs weak states" and the "State back in"?
